#### You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

## What is this product?

#### **Objectives**

The product is in the form of a note issued under English law. It is not an interest bearing security. The payment obligations of the product manufacturer are not quaranteed by any entity.

The product provides the potential for capital growth and does not pay interest. What you will receive at the end of the term of the product is not certain and will depend on the performance of the FTSE 100 Index (the underlying asset). In addition, you will take the risk that some of the value of your investment may be lost at the end of the term of the product. The term of the product will end no later than August 5, 2024. However, we have the right to terminate the product early. Each note has a face value of GBP 1,000. The issue price is 100.00% of the face value. The product is not listed on an exchange.

Call feature: We have the right to terminate the product early on each call payment date upon 5.00 days notice, being each call date shown below. In this case you will receive the call payment amount shown below for each note that you hold.

On August 5, 2024, for each note that you hold you will receive the difference between (i) GBP 1,500.00 (i.e., 150.00% of the face value) multiplied by (A) the closing price of the underlying asset and (ii) GBP 475.00. However, if this is less

than GBP 950.00, you will receive GBP 950.00 (the minimum payment).
The initial reference price of the underlying asset is the closing price on July 27, 2018.
The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying asset, the product and the product manufacturer. 
The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who:

- seek capital growth, expect the movement in the underlying asset to perform in a way that generates a favourable return, have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below and understand that the product may terminate early;
- accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product but otherwise are able to bear a partial loss of their 3.

# What are the risks and what could I get in return?

#### **Risk indicator**







The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 6 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to cash in early. You may have to pay significant extra costs to cash in early.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you

because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This takes into account two elements: (1) the market risk - that the potential losses for future performance are rated at a low level; and (2) the credit risk - that poor market conditions are deemed very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you. You are entitled to receive back at least 95.00% of the face value of the product. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash in before August 5, 2024. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The costs shown in the table above represent how much the expected costs of the product would affect your return, assuming the product performs in line with the moderate performance scenario. Disregarding the impact on your return in that scenario, the estimated entry and exit costs as a percentage of the face value are estimated to be 11.1736052632% if you cash in after year 1, 12.2604841849% if you cash in after 3 years and 8.644% if you cash in after the recommended holding period.

The recommended holding period for the product is 6 years as the product is designed to be held until maturity; however the product may terminate early due to an issuer call or an extraordinary event. You have no contractual right to terminate the product prior to maturity.
