80-70 Memory Income Autocall May 2021

INVESTMENT DESCRIPTION

A 6 year investment linked to the performance of the Australian, UK, US and Swiss Indices.

If on any of the Quarterly observation dates, including the Final Observation date, the closing levels of all the Underlyings are at or above 80% of their initial levels, the income will be paid plus any previously missed income payments.

This investment will autocall and mature early if all Underlyings are equal to or above the Autocall Trigger on any Quarterly observation date starting at 24 months. If early maturity occurs, full capital is returned and the investment will end. If early maturity does not occur the investment will continue to the Final Observation date.

At the Final Observation date, if all Underlyings are at or above 70% of their initial levels, then full capital is returned. If any Underlying is below 70% of its original level, capital return will be reduced on a 1-for-1 basis. For example if the worst performing Underlying has fallen to 40% of its original level, 40% of the capital will be returned.


BENEFITS

- Opportunity for regular income payments even where the Underlyings show significant falls.
- A memory feature, whereby income previously unpaid, will be included when the income trigger is next activated.
- Autocall feature potentially shortens the investment term.
- Early maturity provides an opportunity to re-assess client's wealth strategy.
- Daily pricing.

RISKS

- The return is limited to the pre-defined investment terms.
- The income payment is conditional upon the Underlying performance.
- Investors will be exposed to the credit risk of the Issuer. If the Issuer becomes insolvent or cannot make the payments on the Product for any other reason, investors could lose some or all of their investment. A decline in the Issuer's credit quality is likely to reduce the market value of the Product and therefore the price an investor may receive for the Product if they were to sell them in the market.

RATIONALE

Structured products are becoming increasingly popular for investors due to the wide variety of payoffs and levels of protection that can be achieved by the different types of structures that are available.

The opportunity for an income stream can be of key importance to investors as part of their wealth planning. The probability of an income payment being triggered is increased with this investment as an Underlying needs to show a fall of 20% from its initial level on any observation date before the income stream is disrupted.

The investment also benefits from a memory feature so that if any income payments have missed being paid, they will catch-up the next time all Underlyings are above 80% of their initial levels on an observation date.

The four Underlyings detailed overleaf have been selected in order to support the anticipated delivery of that income.

The autocall payoff can bring an early return of capital allowing the opportunity for a re-assessment of investment strategy. The value of this feature cannot be underestimated as it brings with it the opportunity to secure capital value, as well as the chance to take advantage of future market trends.

To manage the capital risk, a final level barrier set at 70% means an Underlying must fall by more than 30% over 6 years before capital is at risk.

SUITABILITY

This product may be suitable for investors who:

- Are seeking the opportunity for higher returns than current cash rates at the time this product was launched.
- Are seeking income rather than growth.
- Understand and accept there is a risk to capital and how the Capital Protection Barrier works.
- Understand the impact of global economic issues and how they will affect the product.
- Understand the criteria which will determine the income payments.
- Are looking to invest for the medium to long term, being happy to remain invested until maturity.
- Can afford to have their cash invested for the full term of the Product.
- Wish to use this investment as part of a well-diversified portfolio.
- Understand that the returns are pre-defined and that they will forgo any growth in the Underlyings which exceeds the fixed level available with this investment product.
- Understand the risk to capital in the event of a counterparty default.
- Should they need to sell their investment, accept that the trading price will likely mean they get back less than they invested.
- Appreciate that income payments are conditional but understand that the memory feature can deliver previously missed income payments.

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THE UNDERLYINGS

The **S&P/ASX 200** measures the performance of the 200 largest index-eligible stocks listed on the ASX by float-adjusted market capitalization. Representative liquid and tradable, it is widely considered Australia's preeminent benchmark index. The index is float-adjusted. The index was launched in April 2000.


The **FTSE 100** Index is a capitalization-weighted index of the 100 most highly capitalized companies traded on the London Stock Exchange. The equities use an investibility weighting in the index calculation. The index was developed with a base level of 1000 as of December 30, 1983.

The **NASDAQ-100 Index** is a modified capitalization-weighted index of the 100 largest and most active non-financial domestic and international issues listed on the NASDAQ. No security can have more than a 24% weighting. The index was developed with a base value of 125 as of February 1, 1985. Prior to December 21, 1998 the Nasdaq 100 was a cap-weighted index.

The **Swiss Market Index** is an index of the largest and most liquid stocks traded on the Geneva, Zurich, and Basel Stock Exchanges. The index has a base level of 1500 as of June 1988.

MOVEMENT IN THE UNDERLYINGS OVER A 16 YEAR PERIOD



16 YEAR BACK-TESTING

Back-testing shows how the investment would have performed historically using data from previous potential strike dates and observations. Although past performance is not an indication of future performance, it can give a factual insight into how the investment would have performed historically.

This 16 year back-test shows the historical data for a full 10 years of 6 year products that could reach the full term.

Of the 2,501 scenarios tested, 23.47% would reach the full term without autocalling and none would have breached the 70% final level barrier.

Every coupon observation has also been tested, and out of all 2,501 scenarios tested, 91.23% of coupons would have been paid.
