This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?**Type**

Objectives

The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional interest payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the **underlyings**. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the **maturity date**, unless terminated early. If, at maturity, the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** has fallen below its **barrier level**, the product may return less than the **product notional amount** or even zero.

Early termination following an autocall: The product will terminate prior to the **maturity date** if, on any **autocall observation date**, the **reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is at or above its **autocall barrier level**. On any such early termination, you will on the immediately following **autocall payment date** receive, in addition to any final interest payment, a cash payment equal to the autocall payment of USD 1,000. No interest payments will be made on any date after such **autocall payment date**. The relevant dates are shown in the table(s) below.

Interest: If the product has not terminated early, on each **interest payment date** you will receive an interest payment of USD 36.50 together with any previously unpaid interest payments if the **reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is at or above its **interest barrier level** on the immediately preceding **interest observation date**. Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the **maturity date** you will receive:

- if the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is at or above its **barrier level**, a cash payment equal to USD 1,000; or
- if the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is below its **barrier level**, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the **worst performing underlying**. The cash payment will equal (i) the **product notional amount** multiplied by (ii) (A) the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** divided by (B) its **strike level**.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlyings**, the product and the product issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

When purchasing this product during its lifetime, the purchase price may include accrued interest on a pro rata basis.

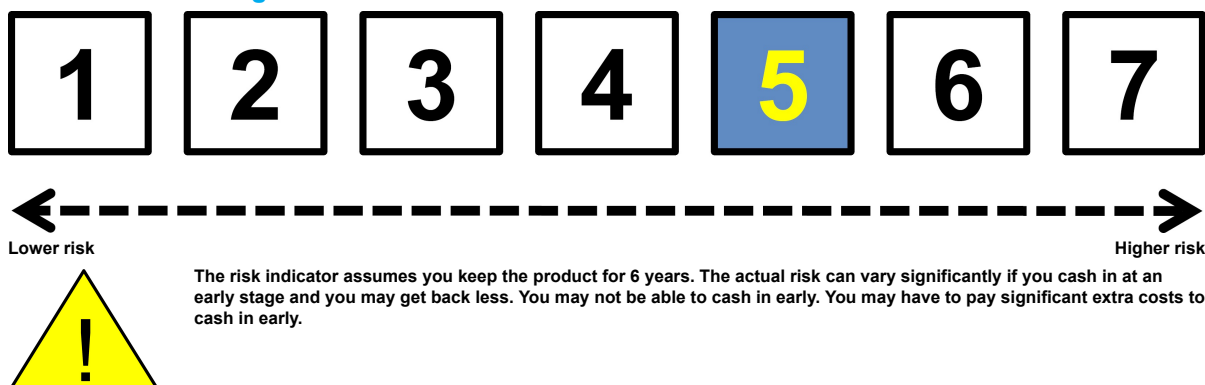

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance of the underlyings at a medium-high level and the potential for us to be unable to pay you any amounts due as very unlikely.

To the extent the currency of the country in which you purchase this product differs from the product currency, please be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

This table shows the money you could get back over the next 6 years under different scenarios, assuming that you invest USD 10,000.

The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. You can compare them with the scenarios of other products. 3. What happens if the manufacturer is unable to pay out?

4. What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest USD 10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

The costs shown in the table above represent how much the expected costs of the product would affect your return, assuming the product performs in line with the moderate performance scenario. Disregarding the impact on your return in that scenario, the estimated entry and exit costs as a percentage of the **product notional amount** are estimated to be 11.61% if you cash in after 1 year, 11.61% if you cash in after 3 years and 11.11% if you cash in at the end of the recommended holding period.

The split of the actual estimated costs of the product as a percentage of the **product notional amount** is estimated to be as follows: entry costs: 11.11% and exit costs: 0%.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 6 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 5 May 2028 (maturity).

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. No fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable.
